**When will test securities be available for NASDAQ's upcoming Single Book?**

On July 24, 2006, NASDAQ® will make test stocks available for testing Single Book functionality over NASDAQ, INET and Brut protocols and interfaces.

**Will there be weekend testing opportunities for Single Book?**

NASDAQ will be announcing weekend testing dates prior to each phase of the integration.

**What is the phase-in schedule for Single Book?**

As announced in [Head Trader Alert #2006-90](#), Single Book integration in NASDAQ-listed issues will occur in a security-by-security phase-in currently scheduled for August of 2006.

Single Book integration in NYSE-, Amex- and regional-listed securities will occur on a single date (not a phased approach), following the completion of the NASDAQ-listed integration, on or after September 1, 2006.

Please note that Single Book integration is subject to Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) approval.

**When will Single Book be approved?**

The SEC has indicated that it will soon act on NASDAQ's [Single Book proposal](#). Further information will be communicated as it becomes available.
